

INSUFFICIENT CLASSROOM SPACE

Insufficient classroom space exists when conditions affect the implementation of the educational philosophy and program of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall determine insufficient classroom space on a case by case basis. Other criteria that may be used by the Board of Directors in its determination may include, but not be limited to, future enrollment projections, available personnel, grade level, educational program, instructional method, physical space, equipment and materials available, finances available, facilities either being planned or currently under construction, sharing agreements in force, bargaining agreements in force, and district goals and objectives. A waiver will be granted in order to prevent the division of a nuclear family between two school districts.

When applications from more than one student in a nuclear family are submitted, if any grade level exceeds this limit, all applications will be denied.

The Board of Directors may not be required to hire additional staff in order to accommodate open enrollment students. Ratios shall be maintained, as required by law, for special education students.

Grade level maximums are as follows:

K-1-2 (220)
3-4-5 (225)
6-7-8 (230)
9-12 (235)
