SUMMER SCHOOL COSTS:

- Cost per period is \$50.00 per student
- If your child is enrolled in the Early Childhood Center (ECC), the cost of Summer School is included in your ECC Summer fees. (See “Child Attending ECC Summer Camp” heading below)
- Bussing to/from Summer School is \$20.00 per student
- \$40 late fee applies to registrations received after May 29, 2009
- Make checks payable to “College Community Schools”

LIMITED TUITION ASSISTANCE

Summer School is a “stand-alone” program, meaning that the school district does not receive federal or state funding to offer this program. The dollars paid in summer school fees are the only means of support for this program. Therefore, all summer school classes are optional. Teachers may recommend that it would be in your child’s best interest to take a Summer School academic class, but it is not required. Limited financial assistance is available. Only those requests received by May 29, 2009, in the form of a written letter addressed to Dick Whitehead, Superintendent of College Community Schools will be considered for financial assistance. CLASSES OFFERED

On the following pages are the courses we plan to offer. Classes are assigned a period and offered according to grade level. Students should choose their grade level based on their current grade. All classes will be held at Prairie Creek School (formerly Prairie Middle School). We encourage all students to sign up for all three periods. We also suggest that they sign up for at least two academic classes (i.e. reading, math, science, etc). Final course offering is determined by enrollment. It is important to list at least five different choices on the registration form.

TRANSPORTATION
